

Submission Guidelines

Key Submission Elements

The use of an electronic medium for the E-Poster requires that each abstract submission involve the following discrete elements:

1. Title of E-Poster (50-word limit): The title should clearly and succinctly identify the contents of the abstract.
2. Poster should be written ONLY in the English language.
3. Authors and Affiliations: Enter each author separately and identify whether the individual is the primary author or a coauthor. Enter each name by providing the author's name and organization.
4. Category: The following category selections will be available:
 - Care and therapies
 - Data and registries
 - Learning and education
 - Social and behavioral
5. Abstract Text (250-word limit): The text of each abstract should consist of no more than 250 words. Do not include your title and author information as part of the abstract body. Do not include references, credits, tables and graphics.

Poster size and orientation

Selected E-Posters will be presented digitally during Duchenne Patient Academy. The following size and orientation guidelines must be respected:

1. All E-Posters will be set in landscape style orientation (and all information (i.e. text, data, photos, and figures) must be designed to appear within one window/slide.
2. If you design your E-Poster in PowerPoint (PPT), ALL information must appear within ONE (1) slide.
3. Use Page Setup, choose Widescreen (16:9) or select Slide Size 33,87cm Width and 19,05cm Height.

Acceptance and Rejection Factors

Each abstract is reviewed for adherence to the criteria for Abstract Acceptance. The main factors considered to qualify for inclusion are: clarity, significance, methods, and presentation. The abstract should have clearly defined objectives, be a significant contribution to the Duchenne community, fall in the categories proposed, have a robust method and be interesting, clearly written and logically presented. Abstracts will be rejected if the abstract is deemed not relevant by the reviewing committee, is promotional in nature, solely describe research methods, are focused on medicines research and development, or has multiple submissions by a primary author.

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Poster Abstract Notifications

Once an E-Poster is submitted, the means of communication and notification of status will be via email. The primary author will be sent a letter of notification indicating the acceptance or rejection of the abstract via the email address provided. Abstract results will be sent to the primary author on Thursday November 24.
